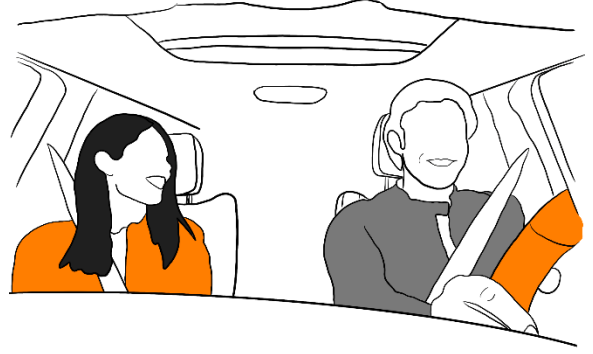


<p>Box 9 B. You drive on the road and at an intersection you see a billboard with the message: “Get involved! Today is your chance!”. What are the ways you can actively participate in society? How would you continue this message?</p>	<p>Box 10 B. You continued the road by car. You have reached the question box. At km 45 you can spot two questions. In order to continue the game, you have to answer to at least one question from the next 3 questions (you can choose whatever question you want): What is active participation? What is democracy? How can a young person participate in community and in their social life?</p>
<p>Box 11 B. On your way, a person stopped you. He asks you for information about the path of discovery you begun. Discuss in your team what you want to do in this journey of discovery and present it in the plenary in one minute - choose a leader that will present in plenary the summary of your discussions.</p>	<p>Box 12 B. You stopped at the first gas station. Here you will find the answering box. Provide at least 5 examples of active participation and participation in democratic life.</p>
<p>Box 13 B. You have the pleasure to be on box 13 B, the bonus round. If you do this bonus round you will be able to advance directly to box 16B. Imagine that you are in a meeting with decision makers from the Youth field, where you have the chance to propose some recommendations regarding active citizenship. The theme of the meeting is democracy and civic engagement of the young people. Discuss in your team possible situations on how the meeting can be (what you discuss, what are the problems you want to debate, what will you say, and other) and simulate the meeting in plenary (maximum 4 minutes). Two people from the team will be the two decision makers, and the others will be young people.</p>	<p>Box 14 B. You're at the gas station. Here is the answering box. Here you will meet 2 people who will use the pantomime to mine a word. Choose 2 people from the team who will mime. The rest of the team will have to guess what the 2 persons will mine.</p>
<p>Box 15 B. You are in the car, and pass by a person who does a civic demonstration (protest). You stop next to her and get out the car. What do you notice around you? Discuss for 5 minutes in your team, then describe and reproduce in a role play what you see in this civic demonstration. Choose a storyteller, a person who will describe what the rest of the team will play. The persons who plays the roles are not allowed to speak.</p>	<p>Box 16 B. You stop and join a group of people who start a civic action. Choose a theme for this civic action. How can you actively involve other people in this civic action?</p>

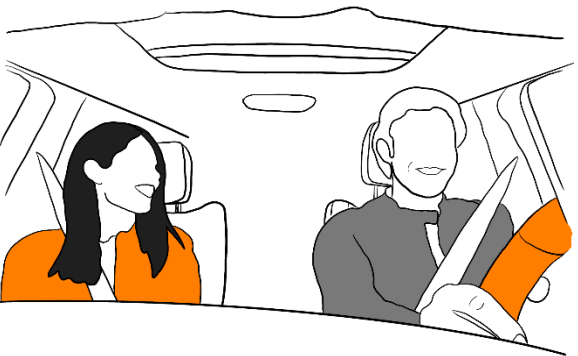

<p>Box 17 B. You continue on your way, but you are tired, you feel the need for a coffee. You stop at the gas station for a coffee. In order to enter you have to guess the password. The password is a word that describes active participation. If you can't guess, the facilitator will give you maximum 2 clues to help you guess. Each clue will make you lose a point, so next time you will roll the dice you will go as far the dice says minus the number of clues you received.</p>	<p>Box 18 B. Together with your travel companions from the car, you will have to discuss freely in plenary and give at least 5 examples of active participation, something that you did and you consider active participation or something that you saw around you. Be spontaneous and do this conversation freely. Let's hear you! You will have 5 minutes to discuss.</p>
<p>Box 19 B. We know that low motivation is one of the reasons for low initiatives. What do you think young people need in order to get involved and be active? Talk to your travel companions from the car, for 5 minutes, and identify at least one idea on how to motivate young people to have more initiatives. Create/ find the solutions and think about its effects. You will have to present the solutions to the big group. You can do this either by establishing a leader from the team that will have to present the ideas or by playing a role play. Choose how you will do it and present it in 3 minutes.</p>	<p>Box 20 B. TURN BACK to box number 9! You forgot one of your luggage.</p>
<p>Box 21 B. Take a break! You need to stop the car so a train can pass. Take this opportunity and admire the surroundings.</p>	<p>Box 22 B. You thought you were about to continue the game, but apparently you are not. Rest and stay a turn (next time when is your turn to roll the dice you are not allowed too, pass the turn to the next team).</p>
<p>Box 23 B. Stop the car to refuel at the gas station. Metaphorically speaking, with what needs to be fuelled the active participation and democracy so they can exist in our society?</p>	<p>Box 24 B. On your car trip you stopped at a traffic light and you listened to a message at the radio. One person from the car next to you wanted the listen to the same message but he couldn't find the radio channel. If you were to reproduce the message in one phrase, what would it sound like? The message should contain the following words: active participation in the society and democracy.</p>
